## 11. House Address Numbers

There shall be no more than two sets of house address numbers on each Lot. Address numbers must be between about 3 inches and about 10 inches in height. If a home has two sets of house address numbers, at least one set must be a minimum of 5 inches in height, must be readily visible from the street, and must have sufficient contrast with the surface upon which the address numbers are mounted to be clearly visible to emergency personnel. The font, color, material and design of the numbers shall be consistent with existing numbers in the community and blend in with the colors and materials of the home and the number styles on surrounding homes.

Numbers mounted on the house may be placed in the following locations:

- Mounted above a garage door or next to a garage door on the front of the home.
- Mounted on the siding or porch pillars near the front door.

The following additional restrictions apply:

- Address numbers may not have built-in lighting.
- Address numbers may not be painted or located on the curb, driveway, or any other cement surface.
- Address numbers must be mounted. Address numbers may not be painted or printed onto any underlying surface.
- Adding, removing, or moving address numbers requires DRC approval.

The following are examples of acceptable address number designs and placements.
